Guest drummers will be invited to share their knowledge and skills with students and drums will be displayed at our Streets of Learning event.

It allows students to become more immersed in their culture while reflecting and "walking in the footsteps" of their ancestors. Our youth then can pass on their knowledge to future generations and create a legacy of learning within our school. Partnerships will be built with elders and youth that will "grow" this knowledge base. It is important for every individual to have their own drum.

Students will begin to appreciate music and tradition through creative and hands-on learning and realize the intertwining and importance of drumming, singing and dancing in their societies' political and social fabric.

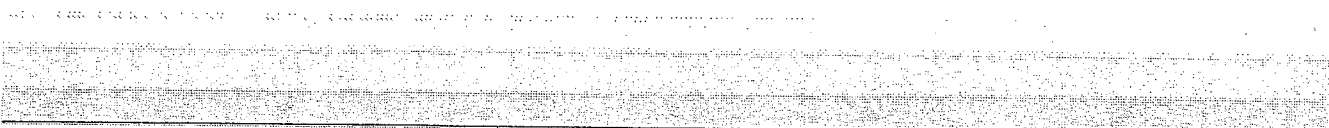
