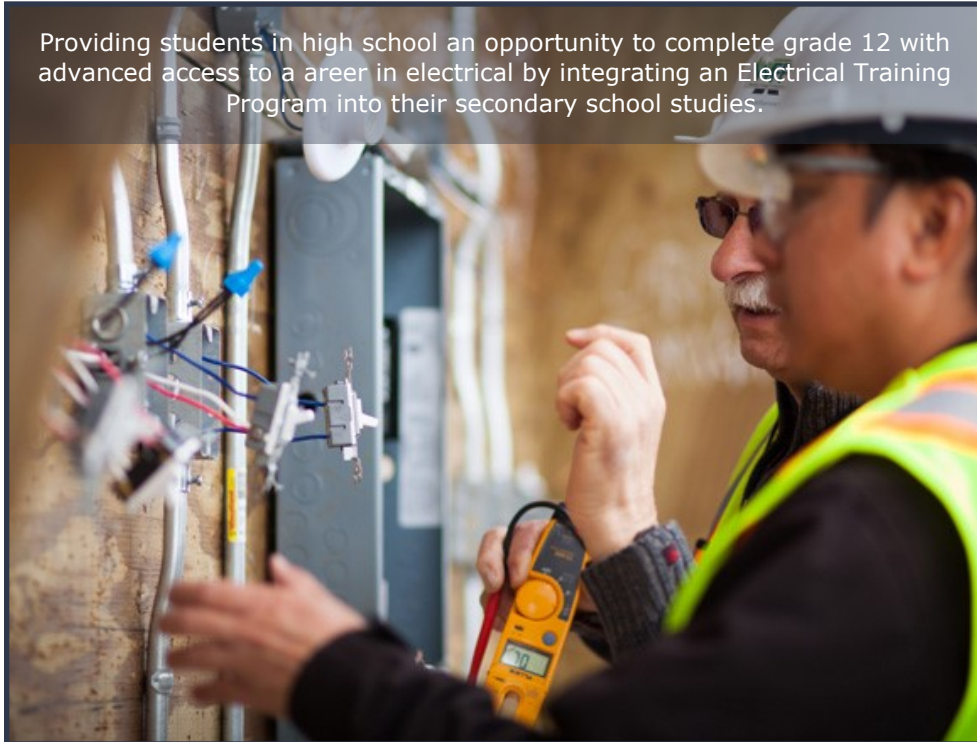

Electricians

Construction Electricians plan, design, assemble, install, alter, repair, inspect, verify, commission, connect, operate, maintain and decommission electrical systems. Electrical systems provide heating, lighting, power, alarm, security, communication and control in residential, commercial, institutional, industrial, transportation, marine and entertainment environments.

Electrician

is a nationally designated trade under the inter-provincial Red Seal program.

ITA Certificate of Qualification (Electrician)

Program Completion requirements?

Completion of technical Training and Achievement Criteria as specified in the Program Outline

- Level 1 in-school assessments and ITA standardized examination

Completion of 1,500 workplace hours.

Program prerequisites:

- Recommended Education - Grade 12 or equivalent including English 12, Mathematics 12, and Science 11

Application requirements:

- Interview with Coordinator of Career Programs of SD 27
- Complete Application Package including an Educational Plan, Resume and Letter of Reference from a community member

Note: After the Career Centre receives and reviews a submitted application, qualifying students will be contacted to complete an Accuplacer Test and arrange and interview with a TRU instructor.

Pre-requisites for the start of post secondary training:

Admission Requirements

- Student will maintain passing marks for all Grade 10/11 core courses
- It is strongly recommended that a student obtain a minimum C average in
 - ⇒ Math 10/11/12 (Pre Calculus 10/11/12 highly recommended)
 - ⇒ English 10/11/12
- Students/parents must attend an **YOUTH TRAIN IN TRADES** Program Orientation session, (prior to the start of post secondary training)

Note: During the orientation session, the instructor will confirm the list of materials the student must purchase.

Benefits of attending an **YOUTH TRAIN IN TRADES** Program:

- Early admission to post secondary studies while still in secondary school
- No post secondary tuition fees while enrolled in an **YOUTH TRAIN IN TRADES** Program
- Choice of entry to employment with enhanced technical skills or continuing post secondary studies

How do I apply?

Applications are being accepted on a first come basis from School District No. 27 student entering in February of their Grade 11 or 12 year.
