## A Welder Level C

is a person who has training in and is capable of welding ferrous and non-ferrous metals in all positions, on both plate and/or pipe, using various welding processes. Certified welders qualify for testing with CSA, BCSA and for ASME procedures in British Columbia.

## Welders

Certified welders will qualify to test for Pressure Welding Procedure tests in British Columbia (PWP), BCP-100. Pressure procedure tests are administered by the BC Safety Authority.

## Welders

is a nationally designated trade under the inter-provincial Red Seal program.

## Credential issued?

ITA Certificate of Qualification (Welder Level C)

## Program Completion requirements?

Completion of technical Training and Achievement Criteria as specified in the Program Outline

- In-school 7 months technical credit
- Work Based 5 months practical credit
- Sponsor attestation - logbook

## Program prerequisites:

- Recommended Education - Grade 10 or equivalent including English 10, Mathematics 10, and Science 10
- Preferred grade 12

## Application requirements:

- Interview with Coordinator of Career Programs of SD 27
- Complete Application Package including an Educational Plan, Resume and Letter of Reference from a community member

*Note:* After the Career Centre receives and reviews a submitted application, qualifying students will be contacted to complete an Accuplacer Test and arrange and interview with a TRU instructor.

## Pre-requisites for the start of post secondary training:

### Admission Requirements

- Student will maintain passing marks for all Grade 10/11 core courses
- It is strongly recommended that a student obtain a minimum C average in
  - ⇒ Math 10/11 (Foundations Math preferred)
  - ⇒ English 10/11
- Students/parents must attend a **YOUTH TRAIN IN TRADES** Program Orientation session, (prior to the start of post secondary training)

*Note:* During the orientation session, the instructor will confirm the list of materials the student must purchase.

## Benefits of attending a **YOUTH TRAIN IN TRADES** Program:

- Early admission to post secondary studies while still in secondary school
- No post secondary tuition fees while enrolled in an **YOUTH TRAIN IN TRADES** Program
- Choice of entry to employment with enhanced technical skills or continuing post secondary studies.

## How do I apply?

Applications are being accepted on a first come basis from School District No. 27 student entering in February of their Grade 11 or 12 year (full year enrollment).
