# Cariboo-Chilcotin Learning Alongside





### **Learning Alongside Days**

Early career teachers in Cariboo-Chilcotin have access to a district mentor teacher (matched from a pool of recently retired teachers) to do co-teaching and other classroom embedded support, and/or release for visitations to other classrooms.

- First-year teachers up to 5 days
- Second-year teachers up to 3 days
- Teaching on Letter of Permission up to 3 days

These days are at the request of the new teacher. They are intended to be driven by what the teacher wants to focus on to best support their needs. Mentors will be matched with new teachers based on the online application the new teacher completes.

New teachers may arrange **visitations to other classrooms** on their own or with the assistance of their principal, CCTA pro-d rep, or other colleagues who can recommend teachers who are great models for what the new teacher wants to see.

All release is done through the online leave system (Atrieve) using the leave reason "Mentorship"



### In-School Buddies





All first-year teachers will be partnered with a "buddy" at the same school. This colleague will be a go-to person for quick questions, support with school routines and processes, etc.

- Use of MyEd student information system (attendance, reporting, recording home contact, etc.)
- Atrieve online HR system (leaves, pay information, expense claims, etc.)
- Local Territory acknowledgement
- Roles of others in the school (ISW, YEW, librarian, etc.)
- School-based and classroom funds available
- Connecting with First Nation knowledge keepers
- First Nations Resource Centre
- First Nations Education Council (FNEC) project grants
- Walking field trips
- CCTA information (staff rep)
- Preparing for parent-teacher events
- Effective parent contact
- Extra-curricular
- Day plans and planning for TTOCs
- School routines
- Getting to know colleagues and local community
- Other day to day supports

The school will be provided with a budget of \$250 per pair of new teacher and buddy. The decision for how these funds are expended to support the buddy/new teachers will be made at the school level. Often it is used for food, coffees, or other treats, but the teachers involved will know what would be most helpful and appreciated. Funds will be allocated to the school budget and spending will be managed at the school level with principal approval and following school processes.

## Resource Support

- First-year teachers \$500 for resources
- **Second-year teachers** \$500 for resources
- **Teaching on Letter of Permission** \$500 to school for resources

As above, funds will be allocated to the school budget and spending will be managed at the school level.
