professional driver, travel in commercial plane with professional pilots, take appropriate nausea medication for travelling, students will dress for all types of weather and bring hats, glasses and sunscreen, students will be assigned a buddy and must always travel with larger group and chaperones or smaller groups with assigned chaperone, all students will have supervisor's cell phone, proper warm up and cool down before and after each performance, list all dietary restrictions so meals are appropriate.

DISCUSSION




Attendance by Year - All Students






Attendance by Year – Indigenous Students

Attendance by Year and Group




Attendance by Year – Status in Community

Attendance by Year and Group




Attendance by Year - Status Out of Community


Attendance by Year – Children and Youth In Care
